Four Guiding Principles for AI in Your Child's Life

PRINCIPLE	THE AI TRAP	THE HUMAN TRUTH	YOUR MOVE
H Human Connection is Irreplaceable	Simulation: AI mimics or even attempts to replace human interaction.	Brains wire in response to the full social ensemble: language, gaze, touch, and more; and the power of the parent-child bond remains unparalleled.	Prioritize the Human: Don't assume AI can provide the key ingredients of human interaction. If a screen replaces a human bond, say no.
O Own your Imperfections	Frictionless: AI is seamless, patient, and efficient.	Humans learn to connect through "micro-repairs"—the messy struggle to be understood—and the resolution of conflict.	Embrace the Mess: Trust that "good enough" parenting builds social competence better than a perfect machine.
P Protect the Early Years	Kids as Mini Adults: AI is changing adult lives now, so we should expose kids early.	The 0-5 brain is plastic and indiscriminately absorbs input; interactions build the very circuits that will prepare kids to think critically and thrive in an AI world.	Guard the Gate: Delay introduction of interactive AI to protect early development and ensure humans shape those brains.
E Enhance, Don't Replace	Irresistible Relief: AI can stand in as tutor, nanny, or friend when parenting feels hardest.	Parents need tools that reduce mental and logistical loads so you can focus on connection—not replace connection altogether.	Be the Pilot: Use AI as a "Co-Pilot" to save time or gain insight, but never put parenting on autopilot.

Use What Evolution Gave You

SYSTEM (the 5 S's)	WHAT IT DOES	WHY AI CAN'T MATCH IT
1. SYNC <i>(Brain-to-Brain Connection)</i>	Your neural network syncs with your child's during interaction	AI can't co-regulate—it doesn't have a brain
2. SPOT <i>(Hypervigilant Pattern Recognition)</i>	You can pick out your baby's cry in a room of wailing babies	AI learns population-level averages, not YOUR child's patterns
3. SENSE <i>(Emotional Radar)</i>	Your stress hormones rise when your child is upset	AI doesn't feel; it calculates
4. STORE <i>(The Ultimate Database)</i>	You accumulate years of knowledge about YOUR specific child	No algorithm has your history or your unique expertise
5. SCAN <i>(Social Intelligence)</i>	Decoding peer dynamics, teacher relationships, situational safety	AI can't truly read the room

The New Hard Skills

SKILL	WHY IT MATTERS	HOW TO NURTURE IT
Critical Thinking	The ability to analyze, question, and evaluate is essential when AI produces answers that are often far from perfect—and sometimes objectively wrong.	Encourage curiosity, ask open-ended questions, and provide opportunities for unstructured problem-solving.
Empathy & Emotional Intelligence	Understanding and sharing the feelings of others is uniquely human. Reading a room, sensing struggle, noticing when something is off—these skills can't be simulated.	Model empathy, talk about emotions, read/watch & discuss character-driven stories, and encourage perspective-taking.
Genuine Creativity	Generating new ideas and seeing the world in novel ways is the engine of innovation. AI creates by copying; humans create with intention, inspired by lived experience.	Provide open-ended toys, encourage imaginative play, and value process and free expression over polished products.
Interpersonal Connection	The ability to genuinely connect with others, build trust, repair misunderstandings, and navigate human relationships is a major advantage that cannot be automated.	Prioritize serve & return interactions, encourage cooperative play, and model conflict resolution skills.
Moral & Ethical Judgement	Deciding between right and wrong, weighing competing values—these are complex, essential human skills. AI can optimize outcomes, but it cannot take responsibility for its choices.	Discuss dilemmas openly, explain your reasoning, and let children practice making values-based decisions.
Adaptability and Resilience	Everyone is going to need to be able to navigate change, learn from failure, and bounce back from adversity—especially in a rapidly changing world.	Allow children to experience manageable challenges, frame failure as a learning opportunity, and model resilience.

Investigation Framework

D.E.T.E.C.T	DESCRIPTION
Design	What is this thing designed to do? For example, is the system intended for education, entertainment, or companionship? Is it meant to work directly with the child, or through the parent/caregiver?
Ethics	Was this product trained on a dataset representing diverse backgrounds, abilities, and communication styles?
Troubles	Are there any signs that this tool has had troubling consequences for other children?
Evidence	Is there any independent evidence beyond marketing that this product works or delivers its advertised benefits?
Confidentiality	How will my data or my child's data be stored and used, and will it remain confidential?
Teachings	What is this system likely teaching my child in general, and particularly about values?
